# DETAILED TRIP ITINERARY

## Day 1

### UK/ Rio de Janeiro



Depart the UK on a flight to Rio de Janeiro, a journey of approximately 13 hours.

You will be met upon arrival by the Steppes Travel representative at the airport and transferred to your hotel. All transfers are private (unless stated otherwise) and included in your trip, however it will not detail every transfer on this itinerary.



As the Brazilians say, 'God made the world in six days, the seventh he devoted to Rio'. Founded by the Portuguese in 1565, Rio de Janeiro was the capital of Brazil from 1763 until 1960. Nestled between the mountains and the sea, Rio is unsurpassed for its natural beauty. Its magnificent shoreline, with charming bays and beautiful beaches, is an important part of Rio social life and offers numerous outdoor activities from biking to surfing. In the mountains above Rio, you will find the Tijuca national forest, the largest natural urban park in the world. The city's eight million inhabitants, known as 'Cariocas', are friendly, carefree people who always seem to find time for the pleasures of good living.

## Days 2 & 3

### Rio de Janeiro



Days to spend independently as you choose in Rio. Here are some of the best ways to spend your time in this buzzing city; any of these suggestions can be pre-booked for you:

- Learn how to Samba at a dance school
- Climb up to Corcovado, the statue of Christ for an incredible view over the city and Guanabara Bay
- People watching on Copacabana Beach
- See a football match at Maracana Stadium
- Listen to live Bossa Nova in a restaurant in Ipanema
- Visit the botanical gardens with their famous avenue of imperial palms
- Board the cable car to the top of Sugar Loaf Mountain
- Relax on a choice of beautiful beaches
- Join a favela tour (shanty towns)
- Explore the restaurants and night life scene
- Day trip to Petropolis - the Summer Residence of the Imperial family of Brazil
- Day trip to Paraty and a Schooner boat trip

## Day 4

### Rio de Janeiro/Iguazu

Depart Rio de Janeiro on the flight to Iguazu.



Iguazú; Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil meet where the Iguazú river joins the Paraná river in the north-eastern Argentinian province of Misiones. It is here that the Iguazú Falls (meaning 'Big Water' in the local Guaraní language) plunges over hard granite into a wide gorge in a series of gigantic waterfalls measuring two miles in length and plunging more than 240 feet below. The thunderous roar of crashing water and the multicoloured mist which rises above the falls is natural beauty and grandeur at its best. Opportunity to visit the different sides of the falls, plus a choice of jungle excursions, boat trips or a visit to the Brazilian/Paraguayan hydroelectric complex, Itaipu, the world's largest. There is a small entrance fee of approximately 9USD to Iguazu National Park.

## Day 5

### Iguazu

Day at leisure to relax and explore Iguazu. Here are some of the best ways to spend your time. (Any of the below can be pre-booked for you)



- Helicopter flight over the falls and surrounding area
- Macuco Safari - half day trip on the Brazil side of the falls by jeep and boat right up to the falls (pack a water proof!)
- Visit Itaipu on the Brazil side - the largest hydro electric power dam in the world
- Night time walking tours which cast a blue halo over the falls
- Explore either the Brazil or Argentinean side of the falls for a different perspective
- Wander the forest trails and experience the fabulous flora and fauna
- Visit the fascinating bird farm on the Brazil side

## Day 6

### Iguazu/Pantanal

Depart Iguazu on a flight to the Pantanal.



The Pantanal or wetlands of Mato Grosso are one of nature's last frontiers, the world's largest animal reserve and home to more than 600 different species of birds and 230 varieties of fish, it is made up of a huge lowland plain, entirely overgrown by lush vegetation and covered with flowers that bloom during the rainy season (December-April). The Pantanal includes many rivers and crystalline lakes as it used to be a vast inland sea. Rare species of birds and other animals seek shelter along their shores and cluster around the diminishing pools during the dry season from May through to November.



*Overnight at your chosen lodge in the Pantanal on a full board basis.*

## Days 7 & 8



## Pantanal

Choose from the many daily excursions available at the lodge, and be taken into the heart of the Pantanal by an expert bilingual guide to where the best wildlife is to be seen, travelling either by boat, on foot, jeep or horseback.

*Overnight at your chosen lodge in the Pantanal on a full board basis.*

## Day 9



## Pantanal/Salvador

Depart the Pantanal on a flight to Salvador.

During colonial times (until 1763), Salvador was the capital of Brazil and is one of the oldest cities. The riches generated by the cultivation of sugarcane and cocoa made Salvador an enormously wealthy city. The legacy of this wealth can be seen not only in its buildings and monuments but also in its distinctive African culture. Dating back to when labour was brought over from Africa to work the plantations, Salvador displays folklore and pageantry - namely Candomblé and Voodoo ceremony - as well as a rich mix of music, dance, exotic food and a beautiful people.

*Overnight at your chosen hotel in the Salvador on a bed & breakfast basis.*

## Day 10



## Salvador

Day at leisure to relax at your hotel or explore the many sights in town.

Visit Barra Lighthouse that protects one of the largest bays in the world and was built using the foundations of the Santo Antonio fort, or the colourful Pelourinho district declared in 1985 an UNESCO World Monument and Latin Americas largest colonial area with buildings dating back to the 16th & 17th century. In the evening you could visit to the low key, yet excellent Folkloric show. Witness the rhythmic African drumming, the martial art of Capoeira and the religious traces of condomble.

## Day 11



## Salvador/Chapada da Diamantina

You will be collected from your hotel and transferred to Chapada da Diamantina; a scenic journey of approximately 5 hours.

Lencois was founded in 1844 to exploit the diamonds found in the surrounding mines. The climate is pleasant and this is the gateway to the Chapada Diamantina National Park with excellent trekking, rock formations and beautiful waterfalls to discover. Lencois is a colonial gem with many historical monuments and churches to visit and has a much laid back pace.

*Overnight at your chosen Pousada in Chapada da Diamantina on a bed & breakfast basis.*

**Days 12 & 13**



### **Chapada da Diamantina**

Day at leisure to explore Chapada de Diamantina National Park.

You might choose to take an expedition by jeep, foot or on horseback with a guide into the Chapada de Diamantina National Park famous for its beautiful waterfalls, table-top mountains, natural pools and extensive underground caves and multi-coloured sands.

**Day 14**



### **Chapada da Diamantina/ Praia do Forte**

You will be collected from your hotel and transferred to Salvador. Upon arrival transfer up the beautiful coast to the fishing village of Praia do Forte.

The fishing village of Praia do Forte takes its name from the castle built by a Portuguese settler in 1556. Relax and unwind on the beautiful beach or go swimming and snorkelling in the warm sea. Explore the surrounding wetland which is rich in bird, animal and plant life or visit The Tamar Project, where the sea turtles lay their eggs, funded by the Worldwide Fund for Nature.

*Overnight at your chosen hotel in Praia do Forte on a bed & breakfast basis.*

**Days 15 & 16**



### **Praia do Forte**

Days to relax on the beach or visit the village, explore the surrounding wetland which is rich in bird, animal and plant life or visit the Tamar Project with a guide from the project, a kilometre along the coast where the sea turtles lay their eggs and some turtles live in tanks for educational and research purposes. You can also walk; see wildlife and boating excursions as well as any number of water sports and riding.

### **Praia do Forte/Salvador/UK**

Transfer to Salvador and depart on a flight to the UK, flying overnight

Arrive UK
